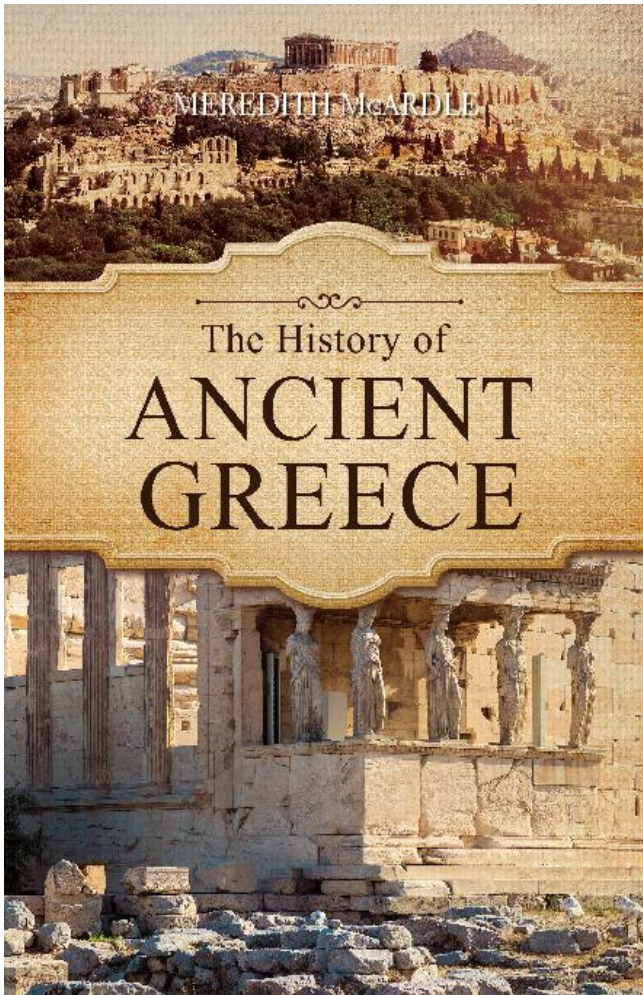

## THE HISTORY OF ANCIENT GREECE



The Greek civilisation was the foundation upon which European society was built. The original 'Classical' world, its letters *alpha* and *beta* gave us our alphabet. Ancient Athens was the site of the first democracy. The philosophers Plato, teaching at the Academy, and Aristotle with his Lyceum, were among the Greek thinkers who influenced the way Western philosophy developed. Greek theatre has had an impact down through the ages with plays such as *Lysistrata* or *Oedipus Rex* being performed today. Without the ancient Greeks, we would not have the Olympic Games, and there would have been no Classical ideas to rediscover in the Renaissance.
